The Washington State Legislature authorized a one-time PHP payment titled "mental health case rate increases" to the RSN's. Per MHD Fiscal Section, the \$591,343 is the balance of the Title XIX PHP State Consolidated dollars due the NSRSN for FY 2002 (7/1/01-6/30/02) for the Medicaid Eligible population served during that time period.

NSRSN staff recommends that the 4.75% (approximately \$28,000) Administrative/Operating Budget carveout does not apply to these RSN/PHP Title XIX funds and that 100% of this PHP payment goes to APN for services rendered in the time period above.

1. Call to Order; Introductions – Chair

Chair Ward Nelson convened the meeting at 1:30. Introductions were made of all present.

Chair Nelson announced Michael White as Employee of the Quarter. He read aloud and presented Michael with a certificate and engraved plaque to be displayed in the reception area.

2. Revisions to the Agenda – Chair

Chair Nelson pointed out changes to the Consent, Action, Emergency Action, and Introduction portion of the agenda.

3. Approval of Minutes – Chair

It was moved, seconded and approved to accept the June minutes.

4. Comments & Announcements from the Chair None

5. Reports from Board Members

Andy Byrne announced that Whatcom County had received a "Service Excellence" award from the Statewide Mental Health Advisory Council. Programs specifically recognized in the award

were the mental health case management project in conjunction with the jails and the peer counseling/community outreach program at the Rainbow Center. The award will be presented in August at the stakeholder meeting.

Ward Nelson reported that mental health parity has full support of both sides so far. He also referred to a recent newspaper article illustrating the Lighthouse Mission's frustration with being a "dumping ground" for the mentally ill. It is not designed as a treatment facility. Dave Ashton will assist in writing guidelines for sending folks to the mission. Better coordination of services is needed. Jere LaFollette assured the group that their agencies don't intend to dump people in other counties. Jim Teverbaugh agrees that we need to figure out integration of care rather than quarantining people. Jane Relin shared that she is very aware of shortage of shelter beds. She is currently working on a shelter for the mentally ill, but funding is needed.

Barb LaBrash brought up the Medicaid cuts relating to prescription drug reimbursement. Two out of the three available pharmacies in her county will no longer honor medical coupons. Ward Nelson added that many pharmacies are closing services to Medicaid consumers. The state's alternatives are to possible institute a mail order method for filling prescriptions, and also to reimburse for transportation to a participating pharmacy. He is very disturbed by these alternatives. Jess Jamieson stated that proper prescription maintenance keeps people successful in their care. The state's alternatives are not feasible. This barrier to services is a serious statewide problem!

Rodney Lund reported that he had seen a CSPAN production that showed that a similar program in another state saved \$57 per patient, but increased community care cost by \$1500.

Bill Thorn reminded the group that when people go off their meds, the impact is found at the county level, either in the county health system or criminal justice system.

Jim Teverbaugh feels Chair Nelson should draft a letter to the Governor about the impacts of the current Medicaid plan for prescription reimbursement, and the state's alternatives.

It was moved, seconded and approved to recommend Chair Nelson draft such a letter to Governor Lock and DSHS Secretary Braddock.

6. Comments from the Public – Chair

Jess Jamieson offered an update on he Children's Crisis Facility, which opened on July 5th. As of today's date, the facility is full.

Rodney Lund received an alert from Tom Richardson that tonight and Friday night MTV would be broadcasting a program about adolescents with bi-polar disorder.

Shirley Conger, NSRSN Ombuds invited the Board to judge posters at the August Board Meeting. There will be public viewing of the posters on August 29th.

7. Report from the Advisory Board – Eileen Rosman, Chair

8. Report from Executive/Personnel Committee – Dave Gossett, Chair

None, there was no meeting.

9. Report from the Planning Committee – Dave Gossett, Chair

Dave Gossett reported that the Committee had met on July 9th. It was decided to form work groups to work on: 1) updating the Mission Statement, and change the name of the NSRSN, 2) Serving consumers involved in the criminal justice system, 3) Serving special populations. Projects still in progress are Recovery Model, Expanding Community Services, and Employment. Mr. Gossett called for volunteers for the three workgroups. Chair Nelson cautioned that he would be happy to make appointments to these committees if need be!

10. Report from QMOC Committee – Andy Byrne, Chair

Andy Byrne reported that QMOC met on July 17 and discussed six items. Wendy Klamp offered the QM report and a report on the Access Review, Rosemary Lea gave an update on he APN QM work plan, the group heard a HIPAA update, and Debbie Page offered a report on Expanding Community Services.

11. Report from the Executive Director – Chuck Benjamin, Executive Director

In Mr. Benjamin's absence, Deputy Director Greg Long reported briefly on:

- Access Review: Overall very positive; some work is needed
- APN met with RSN staff about where funding goes in a capitated grant. Hope to make presentation to Board in September.
- Hopes for large participation in the Recovery Conference slated for November 13
- Need to celebrate the ECS program, which began in July. Fourteen people originally came out of WSH, two back in but we're pulling them back out. This was a great collaborative effort.
- The GLBT clinical training for July is over-subscribed, training scheduled for late Fall is already full.

12. Report from the Finance Officer – Bill Whitlock

Mr. Whitlock offered his report, directing members to his report. The June financial statement shows no major variances. Overall, agency is doing better than anticipated.

13. Report from the Finance Committee – Mike Shelton

In Mr. Shelton's absence, Bill Thorn offered the report. He outlined and recommended approval of the Consent Agenda.

14. Consent Agenda – Ward Nelson, Chair

Moved and seconded to approve Motions 02-036, 02-035 all in favor, motion carried.

Motion to approve Motion 02-034. Discussion followed.

Jim Teverbaugh inquired as to why the Case Rate Increase dollars were passed through only to APN and not other providers? Mr. Whitlock explained that this was contractual. Mr. Teverbaugh stated that it seems the money should go to all providers.

Greg Long clarified that we partially funded VOA through inpatient savings, which proved to be a poor process. An increased funding formula was developed. SeaMar has not come to us for more dollars as they have other sources. He explained that this motion had received a vote of 8 ayes and 4 nays at the Advisory Board meeting.

Mr. Thorn recommended pulling the motion since there are so many questions about it.

It was moved, seconded, and approved to withdraw motion 02-034, holding it in committee for one month. Staff will clarify contract obligations.
