All matters listed with the Consent Agenda have been distributed to each Board Member for reading and study, are considered to be routine, and will be enacted by one action of the Board of Directors with no separate discussion. To review and approve the North Sound Mental Health Administration's claims paid from April 1, 2015 through April 30, 2015 in the amount of \$7,218,516.24. Payroll for the month of April in the amount of \$157,689.12 and associated employer benefits in the amount of \$89,703.17.

15. Action Items

Electronic Health Records

The following contract is being amended to cover the costs of EHR conversion. \$76,250 of this amount is to cover their cost to convert Compass Health Whatcom to the Compass Health EHR we are funding 100% of these costs. The other \$33,995 is to cover other unanticipated costs related to their EHR upgrades. We agreed to fund 50% of these costs.

Motion #15-37

To approve NSMHA-COMPASS HEALTH-EHR PSC-12-15 Amendment 4 for the purpose of increasing funding by \$93,248 additional costs related to the implementation of the Electronic Health Records System. \$76,250 of this amount is to cover their cost to covert Compass Whatcom to the Compass Health EHR we are funding 100% of these costs. The other \$33,995 is to cover other unanticipated costs related to their EHR upgrades. We agreed to fund 50% of these costs. The new maximum consideration on this agreement is \$1,605,180 with the term of the agreement remaining November 1, 2012 through June 30, 2015.

Crisis Prevention and Intervention Teams

The following State and Medicaid amendments are to implement the redesign of the voluntary crisis services to a mobile outreach service, creating Crisis Prevention and Intervention Teams (CPIT), where a majority of the voluntary contacts will be in the community. The teams will be comprised of a Mental Health Professional and a Peer Counselor.

The State contract amendments show a decrease in funding due to the revised ratio of 69% Medicaid and 31% State funding. The overall effect is an increase of funding for the redesign implementation.

NSMHA-COMPASS HEALTH-SMHC-13-15 Amendment 4 for the purpose of decreasing the appropriation of state funding to implement the crisis redesign in Snohomish County. The decrease to this contract is \$72,175 for a new maximum consideration of \$6,923,970 with the term of this agreement remaining the same October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2015.

NSMHA-COMPASS HEALTH WHATCOM-SMHC-13-15 Amendment 5 for the purpose of decreasing the appropriation of state funding to implement the crisis redesign in Whatcom County. The decrease to this contract is \$36,975 for a new maximum consideration of \$2,274,835.69 with the term of this agreement remaining the same October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2015.

Fee For Service Based Rate Change Motion #15-39

To approve the Fee For Service Based Rate Change starting 7/1/15 as detailed below:

We updated our fee for service model to increase the overhead rate from 90% to 105% for each direct labor hour to account for the increased cost of the electronic medical records systems being implemented in our region. We also created an intensive outpatient program fee schedule. We used the same updated calculations as the basic fee for service calculation and changed the productivity assumption from 55% to 48%. This is to account for additional outreach, on call time and over time associated with this program. The current and updated rates are presented below.

Authorized Signatory

In January, by way of motion #15-04, Lisa Grosso, System Operations Manager, was designated on a temporary basis as an authorized signatory for NSMHA accounts with Skagit County Auditor, Treasurer and NSMHA accounts at Skagit Bank for Petty Cash, Advanced Travel and Flexible Spending Account until a Deputy Director was hired and would replace Lisa as the third authorized signatory. Over the last several months it has been realized that due to our growing business needs that it would be best to have an additional

authorized signatory as any expenditure of \$5,000 or more requires two signatures. The motion below adds Betsy Kruse, Deputy Director and also retains Lisa Grosso as authorized signatories.

The purpose of this amendment is to reduce funding due to the discontinuation of the Mobile Crisis Outreach team and transferring the funding to the State and Medicaid contracts for the redesigned voluntary crisis outreach teams.

NSMHA-COMPASS HEALTH WHATCOM-TRIAGE-13-15 Amendment 3 for the purpose of removing \$38,376 for a new maximum consideration of \$2,555,424 with the term of the agreement remaining the same October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2015.

Mental Health Block Grant Contracts (MHBG)

The mental health block grant funding will be contracted to the counties beginning this contract cycle, which is an abbreviated cycle of nine (9) months. The counties, Advisory Board and NSMHA determined the funding priorities as follows:

- Permanent Supported Housing
- Peer Recovery Centers
- Mental Health Outreach with Law Enforcement (Snohomish County)
- Tulalip Tribes-Traditional/Cultural Services to youth and families

The counties will hold the contract with the specific providers, with the exception of Tulalip Tribes, San Juan County and the Whatcom County Rainbow Recovery Center. We believe the counties are poised to have the ability to target and braid local funding to enhance the services in their respective counties.

16. Introduction Items

Compensation Consultant

NSMHA is currently in the introduction phase of procuring a consultant to conduct a compensation survey. The consultant will assist NSMHA in developing a strategic staffing and compensation structure to ensure it has adequate administrative capacity to effectively manage the future Behavior Health Organization. The survey will help us identify what will be necessary to attract and retain qualified staff. It has become evident in our recruiting process that we are now competing with counties with better compensation structures, other managed care organizations, hospitals and other health care organizations in the region.

2015-16 Staffing

NSMHA's leadership has identified the level of staffing needed to respond to the service needs of an expanded population of Medicaid enrollees, manage the increase in new programs and contracts it has taken on, and to manage the future Behavioral Health Organization The attached matrix shows the positions identified to date with the pay range and timeline for hiring. NSMHA is intending to be purposeful and strategic in the building of its workforce.

Mental Health Block Grant Amendments

The following MHBG amendments are removing unspent funding from the San Juan County contracts and moving it to Island County and Tulalip Tribes contracts. Island County will serve additional individuals and families in their supported housing project and Tulalip Tribes will provide additional workshops for Tribal members. This will ensure the money is used for MHBG services and not returned to DBHR at the end of the contract period. The funding must be expended by June 30, 2015.

NSMHA-ISLAND COUNTY-MHBG-13-15 Amendment 3 for the purpose of reallocating funding to increase the funding on this contract by \$30,000 for a new maximum consideration of \$330,000 with the term of the agreement remaining the same July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2015.

NSMHA-TULALIP TRIBES-MHBG-13-15 Amendment 2 for the purpose of reallocating funding to increase the funding on this contract by \$11,918 for a new maximum consideration of \$161,918 with the term of the agreement remaining the same July 1,2013 through June 30, 2015.

17. Discussion Item

Relocation of North Cascades Behavioral Health Facilities

The State Department of Enterprise Services continues to take the position that they will not extend the leases for the new North Sound E&T and Pioneer Center North beyond June, 2018. This means that we need to begin immediately planning for re-location within 3 years. Relocation of the E&T will be the responsibility of the North Sound RSN/BHO. We will need to work with Pioneer Human Services to identify what options they want to pursue. Contracting for CD residential services will be the responsibility of the North Sound BHO, so one way or another, we will also need to plan for our future needs for CD residential beds. The planning for both will require the participation of all 5 North Sound counties. We would like to begin talking with the Board about how they want us to organize this effort.

NSMHA-COMPASS HEALTH WHATCOM-TRIAGE-13-15 Amendment 2 for the purpose of increasing funding for nursing services. The increase to this contract is \$541,488 for a new maximum consideration of \$2,593,800 with the term of the agreement October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2015.

NSMHA-PHS-CRISIS CENTER-13-15 Amendment 2 for the purpose of increasing funding for nursing services. The increase to this contract is \$674,435 for a new maximum consideration of \$2,312,483 with the term of the agreement October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2015.

NSMHA-COMPASS HEALTH-SNOHOMISH TRIAGE-13-15 Amendment 2 for the purpose of increasing funding for nursing and stabilization services. The increase to this contract is \$714,659.97 for a new maximum consideration of \$4,047,630.03 with the term of agreement October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2015.

Medicaid

 This contract is being amended to increase the Medicaid funding for residential services based on actual costs

Motion #15-30

To approve the NSMHA-LWC-MEDICAID-13-15 Amendment 3 for the purpose of increasing funding for residential services. The increase to this contract is \$25,425 for a new maximum consideration of \$4,950,918 with the term of the agreement October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2015.

Joe discussed motions 15-30 and 15-31 with the Board. Jill Johnson moved approval of motions 15-30 and 15-31, seconded by Cammy Hart-Anderson, all in favor, motions carried, #'s 15-30 & 15-31.

• This contract is being amended to increase State funding for residential services based on actual costs

Motion #15-31

To approve the NSMHA-LWC-SMHC-13-15 Amendment 1 for the purpose of increasing funding for residential services. The increase to this contract is \$6,372 for a new maximum consideration of \$1,089,237 with the term of the agreement October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2015.

Joe discussed motions 15-30 and 15-31 with the Board. Jill Johnson moved approval of motions 15-30 and 15-31, seconded by Cammy Hart-Anderson, all in favor, motions carried, #'s 15-30 & 15-31.

North Sound Evaluation and Treatment Center

- The evaluation team is recommending that NSMHA enter into negotiations with Telecare Corporation for the North Sound E&T in Sedro Woolley
- Estimated annual costs of \$4,597,272
- Telecare Corporation currently operates two (2) Evaluation and Treatment Centers in Washington State, in Clark and Pierce counties. Due to their experience in operating E&Ts

and familiarity with Washington WACs/RCWs, we anticipate Telecare to be poised to open the E&T by the target date of July 1, 2015.

Motion #15-32

To approve NSMHA-TELECARE-E&T-15-18 for the purpose of reopening the Evaluation and Treatment Center in Sedro Woolley. The maximum consideration on this contract is estimated to be \$14,140,838 with the term of the agreement April 1, 2015 through June 30, 2018.

Joe explained motion #15-32. Ken Mann moved approval, seconded by Barbara LaBrash, all in favor, motion carried, #15-32.

Motion #15-33

NSMHA-SNOHOMISH COUNTY-MEDICAID-13-15 Amendment 2 for the purpose of increasing funding by \$225,000 to provide additional staffing and resources to increase the capacity to meet the needs of the Everett Municipal Court Mental Health Liaison and VOA 211 assisting in Medicaid application facilitation. The new maximum consideration on this contract is \$1,392,123.36 with the term of the agreement remaining the same October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2015.

Joe and Cammy provided explanation for motion #15-33, noting that Snohomish County has braided several funding sources to support this program. Jill Johnson moved approval of motion #15-33, seconded by Mark McDonald, all in favor, motion carried, #15-33.

15. Introduction Items

We are currently negotiating the Crisis Contracts and will bring them forward for action at the May 14th Board of Directors meeting.

NSMHA-COMPASS HEALTH-EHR PSC-12-15 Amendment 4 for the purpose of increasing funding by \$93,248 additional costs related to the implementation of the Electronic Health Records System. \$76,250 of this amount is to cover their cost to convert Compass Whatcom to the Compass Health EHR we are funding 100% of these costs. The other \$33,995 is to cover other unanticipated costs related to their EHR upgrades. We agreed to fund 50% of these costs. The new maximum consideration on this agreement is \$1,605,180 with the term of the agreement remaining November 1, 2012 through June 30, 2015.

Joe discussed the need for the Compass Health EHR amendment and said the motion would be an action item in May.
