## Policy 1734.02 COVID-19 Interim Crisis Dispatch Protocols Updated October 2020 Initially prepared March 2020

North Sound Behavioral Health Administrative Services Organization (North Sound BH-ASO) Numbered Memorandum 2020-002 implemented temporary limitations to non-essential crisis services to protect the health and safety of our contracted providers and the public in response to the COVID-19 outbreak.

Volunteers of America (VOA) and contracted Designated Crisis Responders (DCRs) shall implement the following interim COVID-19 dispatch protocols:

Note: In response to the COVID-19 outbreak and pending HB 2099 allowing video interviews by DCRs, the
requirement for face-to-face contact prior to the closing of the case through a disposition to VOA is
currently suspended. Alternative methods such as Telemedicine contact are encouraged as applicable.

## **VOA Screening and Referrals**

VOA shall determine the location of the dispatch request and prioritize DCR referrals to emergency departments (Eds), jails, law enforcement and Crisis Stabilization and Triage facilities.

- If the location of the dispatch request is determined to be at a facility or location in which DCRs have been directed to temporally suspend face-to-face outreaches (residential facilities such as assisted living facilities, nursing homes or adult family homes based on current Department of Health (DOH) recommendations), VOA Care Crisis line will:
  - a. Communicate temporary suspension of face-to-face voluntary outreaches and that DCR dispatches may not result in a face-to-face contact;
  - b. Communicate that the DCR office is willing to follow up with the requester(s) and attempt all available alternatives to support the individual.
- 2. VOA will implement the following screening question for crisis dispatch:
  - a. "Have you or anyone in your household currently exhibiting or within the past 14 days been exposed to a person with possible COVID-19 symptoms consistent with WA DOH or CDC criteria.
- 3. If the requester(s) answer is **yes**, or reports as positive for symptoms listed:
  - and VOA <u>determines dispatch is not required</u>, VOA staff will encourage the referent to telephonically contact their primary care provider (PCP) or other health care professional for recommendations; or
  - b. <u>if dispatch is required</u>, VOA will refer the case to the DCR's office to determine dispatch response using methods that minimize COVID-19 exposure risks.

## **Mobile Crisis Outreach - DCR Dispatch**

If the location of the dispatch request is determined to be at a facility or unstaffed location in which DCRs have temporally suspend face-to-face outreaches due to COVID-19 risks, <u>and</u> an alternative location cannot be coordinated to mitigate COVID-19 risks:

1. The DCR will use methods that minimize COVID-19 exposure risk while investigating the case to determine if a Custody Authorization to the ED is warranted for further evaluation and treatment.
