Rebecca Clark	Rebecca gave her report from all the counties. <i>San Juan</i> She said Maryanne Slabaugh has returned to San Juan and was appointed to the NSMHA Advisory Board. They will start collecting the 1/10 revenues on April 1 <sup>st</sup> . They are working on transitioning the oversight of the process to our Advisory Board per our agreement with the County Council. Their plan out of the gate is to work with the schools to provide mental health services to children and provide mental health services to the uninsured. San Juan has the highest rate of uninsured people under age 65 of all counties in the state (30%). <i>Snohomish</i>	Informational	

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	They are getting together member for a Chemical Dependency/Mental Health Program Advisory Board to serve in an advisory capacity regarding implementation and use of the 1/10 sales tax. The Board will include representation from the Mental Health Advisory Board, Alcohol and Drug Abuse Advisory Board, Council of Aging, Children's Commission, Veteran's Assistance Fund Executive Board, County Jail, Superior Court, provider of chemical/drug dependency or mental health services to individual clients and law enforcement. Individual Boards will be providing names of their representative to the Human Services Director.	
	<i>Island</i> They opened their transitional housing program for folks with a mental illness or substance abuse issue who are coming out of jail, prison, or treatment facility. They have three people in the program so far. They are hiring 5.5 Mental Health Professionals for their school based mental health program. This is one of our programs funded by the 1/10 money. They should have it all in place by mid-February.	
	<i>Whatcom</i> They will hold a Stakeholder's Forum February 24 <sup>th</sup> at St. Luke's Educational Center to complete the assessment of need for the 1/10 of 1% sales tax. They are sending out invitations with the date and time. The Mental Health and Substance Abuse Advisory Boards continue to hold joint monthly meetings to improve communication and partnering and develop mutual priorities.	
	<i>Skagit</i> We have moved to our new office at 309 S. 3 <sup>rd</sup> Street, Mount Vernon. We organized a meeting of stakeholders to discuss need for a protocol to respond to community mental health crises. Approximately 29 people attended from a variety of agencies. We will meet again in March to continue planning. We are beginning discussion with NSMHA and providers in response to requests from Anacortes community members to locate services there.	
	Rebecca mentioned discussions have been held through a mental health crisis meeting to coordinate a central point of contact for consumers when a crisis occurs in the region.

	Executive Director's Report	
Chuck Benjamin	Chuck said his report will be centered on the budget cuts of \$1.45 million by June of this year and potential \$1 million dollar cuts in future years. He mentioned NSMHA has conducted a stakeholders meeting to review these cuts and how they will impact providers. He reviewed services the state has said NSMHA can/cannot cut. He stated he is recommending Medicaid B3 funding not be cut. He reviewed the financial spreadsheet utilized to prioritize budget cuts. He added it will be up to NSMHA to take these recommendations and use them as a guide in proposing the revised budget and future budgets. He added more cuts may come forth in March that will affect these proposed cuts in April – June. He mentioned there will be at least one other stakeholder meeting to inform them regarding upcoming changes. Chuck added there is a document in members folders that describe the programs mentioned in the spreadsheet. Chuck said NSMHA is the only Regional Support Network (RSN) that currently requires a Child Mental Health Specialist (CMHS) conduct an assessment on a child; however, with the proposed budget cuts NSMHA will probably have to revert back to having Designated Crisis Responders (DCR) respond to child requests for assessment. Chuck affirmed this is sad news but expects more to come in the future with the economic situation. He knows there will be impacts to the region but assured the members the region will work together to make these impacts as seamless as possible for our providers and consumers.	Informational
