San Juan	San Juan has contracts out for school based mental health services being provided with 1/10 <sup>th</sup> money. Each district is doing things a little differently. Community based mental health services provided with 1/10 <sup>th</sup> money is moving forward for implementation for individual with no insurance. San Juan does not currently have anyone doing mental health evaluations for General Assistance Unemployable (GAU) individuals. The person that was doing this is no longer available and San Juan is looking for someone to provide for this need.	Informational

Snohomish	Marie said they had discussions with people involved with "Project for Assistance in the Transition of Homelessness (PATH)".
