He said the conference had about 150 attendees with an art show and some excellent speakers. He said he shared his personal recovery and a mother/daughter shared their trauma recovery journey. A film called "Unlisted" about a father and child was	Informational

	shown and he recommended viewing it. A deputy was present regarding Crisis Intervention Training (CIT) and shared how families can assist law enforcement in dealing with individuals. Otis said the only negative thing he noticed was mothers/dads there representing their children and speaking on their behalf which did not allow enough time for those present to speak for themselves. He said the spiritual time was a unique experience for those that took advantage of it and the facilities were excellent.

	Executive Director's Report	
Chuck Benjamin	Chuck said we need to remain focused on "Vision of Hope and Path to Recovery" and service to people with mental illness. He thanked the Advisory Board for recommending approval of NSMHA re-organization and based upon the recommendation the Board of Directors (BOD) approved it. He added it is a work in progress, which will result in changes throughout NSMHA. He mentioned expected budget cuts of 4-7% in 2010 and an additional 10% in 2011. He said this would entail \$24.5 million statewide with \$3.5 million for NSMHA. He said a phone	Informational
	conference was held this morning with Dale Jarvis and Barbara Mauer (consultants that conducted stakeholder meetings) to discuss what could be accomplished. Chuck stated he fears the cuts will be larger than the initial 4-7% and 10%. He said if we do not take care of the gravely disabled who will. Mark asked what the 10% would entail for NSMHA. Chuck said stakeholder meetings were held during the last round of cuts and recommendations were made. He added he asked the Planning Committee and BOD if NSMHA could utilize the priorities recommended by the stakeholders at the previous meetings. It was agreed to utilize the recommendations. He said all provisos may be cut and this would end Program for Assisted Living Skills (PALS), Expanded Community Services (ECS), and Jail Services with the possibility of other programs being cut in the future. He said PALS individuals include undocumented aliens and other more seriously ill individuals which would not be covered and/or are hard to place.	
	Candace mentioned the jails are working harder to identify individuals with mental health issues. Discussion followed. Candace mentioned a mobile stabilization team is something being explored in Island County to go out and de-escalate a situation before it becomes a 911 call.	
	Chuck mentioned last year mental health was scheduled to be cut drastically; however, law enforcement went to the Governor	

	asking it not be cut as much and this helped prevent the cuts from being so drastic. He said law enforcement would be a good venue to address budgets cuts for mental illness. Terry Ann said Island County is at a standstill regarding getting law enforcement CIT because they claim they do not have the funds to send anyone to training. She said several people have been arrested which may	
	have been prevented if Island County law enforcement had CIT. She said if someone could just come and talk with them it could be helpful. Discussion followed.	
	Larry asked if any of the stimulus money was applied to mental health. Chuck said some match money was included on both state and federal side but it is continuing on a decreasing scale. Chuck said some FMAP funding was extended. Chuck said on the national level there is some lobbying occurring.	
	Otis asked if the 1/10 funds could be helpful with all the cuts. Chuck said it is filling some gaps; however, this funding is controlled by the Counties and the current economy is causing the available funds to not be as high as expected/hoped.

Snohomish	Discussions have occurred at the Chemical Dependency (CD)/Mental Health (MH) Sales Tax Board meetings around program design needs that must occur before additional steps towards the creation of a Triage Facility can be completed. Program design questions include police drop-off capacity and sub-acute detox configuration. It was agreed that a committee of board members and Human Services staff will be formed to determine the desired program components. The board determined that all interested board members, as well as other interested parties, should tour the Pierce County Crisis Stabilization Unit (CSU), Compass Health's crisis respite program in Everett and their Evaluation and Treatment facility in Mukilteo. A group went down to the CSU in August and was impressed by the facility and what it offers the community. Snohomish County Human Services Mental Health Programs are in the midst this week of their yearly audit by NSMHA.	Informational
