Discussion followed and it was decided the prospective candidates will come to a couple of the Advisory Board meetings and report back to the Counties. Discussion

Joe spoke about the Action Items.

Some Advisory Board Members voiced concern regarding Whatcom Rainbow Recovery Center's current operations, noting it should be more focused on recovery.

Compass, Whatcom County and NSMHA's involvement was discussed. Joe addressed the concerns and offered options, noting Whatcom County Elected Officials will be asked to weigh in on the concerns. He went on to say Mark or David could speak to the Board of Directors. He spoke about a NSMHA Advisory Board Team Audit taking place. Mark stated he feels an audit will not be as effective as compliance written on paper. David added that NSMHA needs to stipulate what a recovery model looks like, implement, assess, and measure outcomes.

Joe noted three County Coordinators agreed to move toward a recovery model, which will result in new language in the contracts. Existing contracts end 3/31/2016, the new contract template will stipulate the model. New contract language will be drafted and brought to the Advisory Board in January so they can weigh in on the language. The new Quality Review Teams will include Advisory Board Members.

A motion was made to take the Action Items to the Board of Directors for approval, with the proposed amendments for future Peer Center Contracts.

Motion was seconded and approved.

Joe pointed out that Advisory Board Members could attend the Board of Directors meetings and voices their concerns. David encouraged their participation and noted the BOD members are highly attentive the Advisory Board member concerns.

Conversation continued regarding the Tele-Psychiatry portion of the Action Items, followed with questions and answers. Joe spoke about a potential webinar on tele-psychiatry to be presented to the AB in 2016.

Discussion followed. Mark requested a vote be taken to determine how many people wanted to include tele-psychiatry in the motion to move the Action Items to the BOD for approval. All were in favor, Motion approved to move the Action Items to the BOD for approval, pending the proposed amendments

All voted in favor of moving Tele-Psychiatry forward to the BOD for approval, in addition to the other Action Items none opposed.

NEW BUSINESS

Pre-Meeting Topics and Site Visits for 2016:

Mark led the Advisory Board in conversation regarding potential Pre-Meetings and Site Visit options for 2016. Joe noted the recommendation from the Executive Committee was to alternate the 2016 Pre-Meetings between Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder issues.

- 3) Pioneer Center North Co-Occurring with main focus on SUD (Pre-Meeting)
- 4) Mental Health and Drug Courts; Joanie will meet with Ron Coakley regarding specific speakers. He said he knows several individuals who would be willing to present to the AB. The possibility of a panel of speakers was discussed as an option.
- 5) Everett Detox Center (Pre-Meeting)
- 6) Lake Whatcom (Site Tour), as well as the summer picnic, this will be listed as two separate site visits on the spreadsheet.

Additional discussion took place regarding other Site Tour options for 2016. It was decided during the January Advisory Board Meeting that Joanie would bring a list of SUD Providers to the meeting for the Board to determine the visits.

Joanie will add the Pre-Meeting recommendations to the Pre-Meeting List and include it in January's AB packet.
