 - These funds are to be used to enhance the existing Child, Family and Youth Crisis Team with Compass Health.
- Recovery Navigator Program (RNP)

- o Compass Health is facing a budgetary gap in funding to maintain three (3) existing staff positions within the RNP Program and has requested \$32,000 of additional funds through December 31, 2025.
- o North Sound BH-ASO is seeking additional RNP funding from HCA to fill the gap for January 1, 2026, forward.

HIGHLIGHTS

- 1. The ratio of Budget to Actuals revenue for State Funds is on target, Medicaid Funds are favorable due to reconciliation payments. Revenues for MHBG and SABG Funds have leveled due to payments catching up with billings. Crisis Services expenses are below the budgeted amount due to the accelerated billing of ARPA funds and the variances between the billing cycle and receiving payment from HCA. Crisis Services large positive variance is due to delayed billing from Providers and utilization of ARPA dollars for Crisis Services. The other variances are mainly due to late payments and late billing. Our Services expenses are currently running close to the budgeted amount. Of note we are budgeting for a loss this year due to utilizing fund balances, accounted for in the revenue section as "Use of Fund Balance".
- 2. The Revenue and Expense statement reflects the Amended Budget Expense for the return of "reserve" Proviso Funds to HCA in the amount of \$4,741,120 showing a net loss of \$4,997,307. The MHBG negative fund balance is due to fluctuations in billing and reimbursement payments from the HCA. Our revenues are covering our expenses. Our general fund balance was \$10,736,657 on 06/30/25. The minimum allowed reserve is \$3,065,156 and the maximum allowed reserve is \$6,130,213.
- 3. The Medicaid fund balance is elevated reflecting the six-month reconciliation payments. The MCO's pay at the beginning of the month, however our expenses are not recognized until the following month.

NOTES

- 1. We are presenting the financial statements for May 2025 for North Sound Behavioral Health Administrative Services Organization (ASO).
- 2. These monthly statements are prepared for the Board's use only. They provide a snapshot of expenses and revenue for a single calendar month compared with a hypothetical "year to date" projection. However, neither revenue nor expenditures occur on an equal 1/12 amount each month.
- 4. The North Sound BH-ASO adopts "calendar year" budgets, the funding allocations from the state is a state fiscal year basis [with adjustments every 6 months]. The exceptions are Federal Block Grant Funds which are allocated for the entire fiscal year.

- 5. Revenues and expenses are managed independently within each of the major funds, categories: Medicaid, State General Fund, Mental Health Block Grant, and Substance Abuse Block Grant.
- 6. Within 'State General Funds', allocations are further subdivided between general state funds, and the multiple "Proviso" funds allocated for specific services.
- 7. We have added two new lines at the bottom of the "Revenue and Expense" tab which shows the beginning and ending fund balance within each fund category for the state fiscal year. Also added are additional lines at the bottom to show the Net Income from Operations before the transfer of funds to the BHO.
- 8. The Budget to Actuals statement includes notes on areas where there is a variance between the hypothetical year-to-date budget and actual revenues and expenditures. I also added additional lines at the bottom to show the transfer of funds separate from the normal operations.












Snohomish - Unduplicated People receiving a crisis system service




