<u>Amendment regarding Motion #25-26</u> (From June 12, 2025, Board of Directors Minutes) North Sound BH-ASO was informed that the overview for Motion #25-26 (GF-S Mandatory Services) contained two errors in the reported funding amounts.

- The Trueblood funding allocation for Island County was incorrectly listed as \$75,982.65. The correct amount is \$7,592.65.
- The Trueblood funding allocation for Skagit County was incorrectly listed as \$75,982.65. The correct amount is \$11,415.37.

New Journeys Program – Sea Mar Community Health Centers

- The New Journeys Program is an evidenced-based, multidisciplinary Coordinated Specialty Care (CSC) model designed for youth and adults aged 15 to 40 who are experiencing first episode psychosis (FEP). The program emphasizes early intervention, with a primary goal of reducing the Duration of Untreated Psychosis (DUP) through targeted outreach and recruitment.
- North Sound BH-ASO has received funding from the Health Care Authority (HCA) to support services for two non-Medicaid individuals per approved New Journeys team in the North Sound region, effective July 1, 2025.

- The total contracted amount for the period of July 1, 2025, through December 31, 2025, is \$24,984.00.
- The Health Care Authority has designated Sea Mar Community Health Centers (Sea Mar) as the eligible provider to receive this funding for the North Sound region.

HIGHLIGHTS

- 1. The ratio of Budget to Actuals revenue for State Funds and Medicaid Funds are on target, actual revenues are close to budgeted revenues. Revenues for MHBG and SABG Funds are negative due to the accelerated billing of ARPA funds and the variances between the billing cycle and receiving payment from HCA. Crisis Services large positive variance is due to delayed billing from Providers and utilization of ARPA dollars for Crisis Services. The other variances are mainly due to late payments and late billing. Our Services expenses are currently running \$1,626,657 under budget mainly due to late Provider billing. Of note we are budgeting for a loss this year due to utilizing fund balances, accounted for in the revenue section as "Use of Fund Balance".
- 2. The Revenue and Expense statement reflects the Amended Budget Expense for the return of "reserve" Proviso Funds to HCA in the amount of \$4,741,120 showing a net loss of \$6,135,541. The MHBG and SABG negative fund balances are due to fluctuations in billing and reimbursement payments from the HCA. Our revenues are covering our expenses. Our general fund balance was \$9,610,388 on 03/31/25. The minimum allowed reserve is \$3,065,156 and the maximum allowed reserve is \$6,130,213.
- 3. The Medicaid fund balance has levelled as we continue implementing the six-month reconciliation and receiving retro PMPM payments. The MCO's pay at the beginning of the month, however our expenses are not recognized until the following month.

NOTES

- 1. We are presenting the financial statements for May 2025 for North Sound Behavioral Health Administrative Services Organization (ASO).
- 2. These monthly statements are prepared for the Board's use only. They provide a snapshot of expenses and revenue for a single calendar month compared with a hypothetical "year to date" projection. However, neither revenue nor expenditures occur on an equal 1/12 amount each month.
- 4. The North Sound BH-ASO adopts "calendar year" budgets, the funding allocations from the state is a state fiscal year basis [with adjustments every 6 months]. The exceptions are Federal Block Grant Funds which are allocated for the entire fiscal year.

- 5. Revenues and expenses are managed independently within each of the major funds, categories: Medicaid, State General Fund, Mental Health Block Grant, and Substance Abuse Block Grant.
- 6. Within 'State General Funds', allocations are further subdivided between general state funds, and the multiple "Proviso" funds allocated for specific services.
- 7. We have added two new lines at the bottom of the "Revenue and Expense" tab which shows the beginning and ending fund balance within each fund category for the state fiscal year. Also added are additional lines at the bottom to show the Net Income from Operations before the transfer of funds to the BHO.
- 8. The Budget to Actuals statement includes notes on areas where there is a variance between the hypothetical year-to-date budget and actual revenues and expenditures. I also added additional lines at the bottom to show the transfer of funds separate from the normal operations.

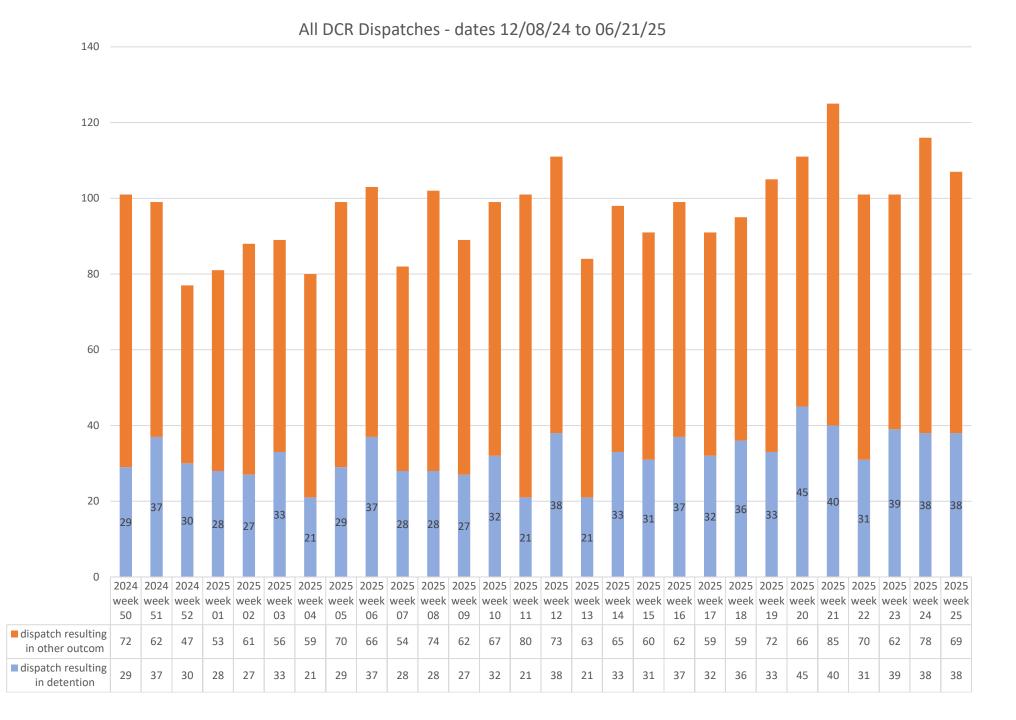

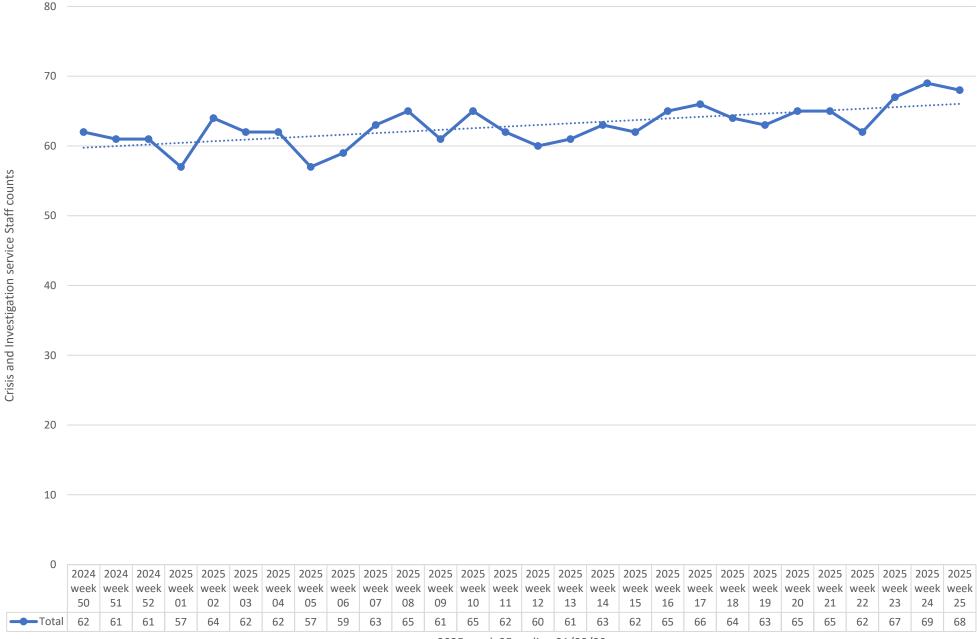

Crisis Data: Ages 0-17 - dates 12/08/24 to 06/21/25

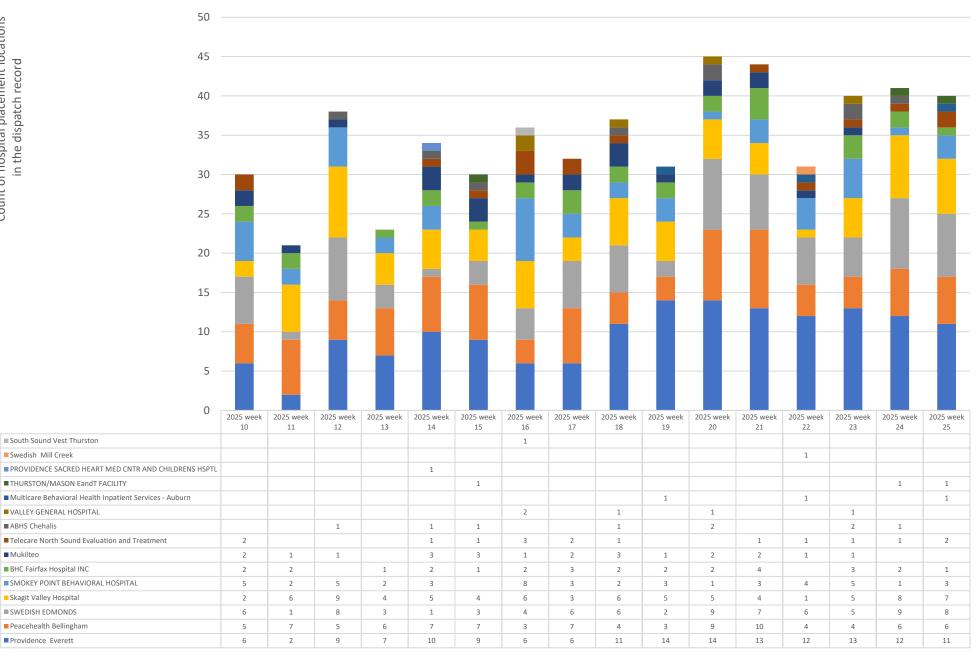

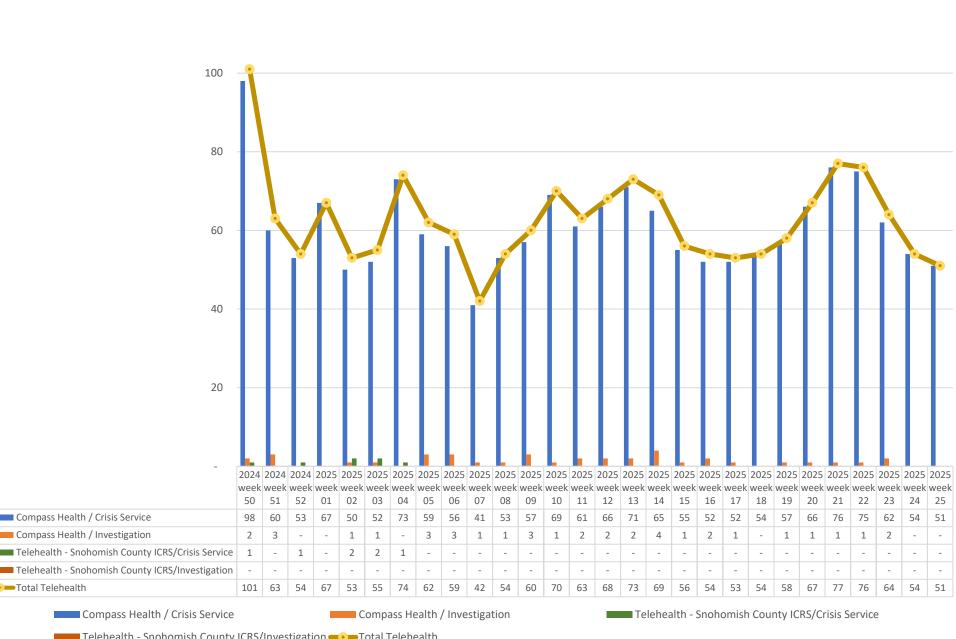


Count of hospital placement locations in the dispatch record

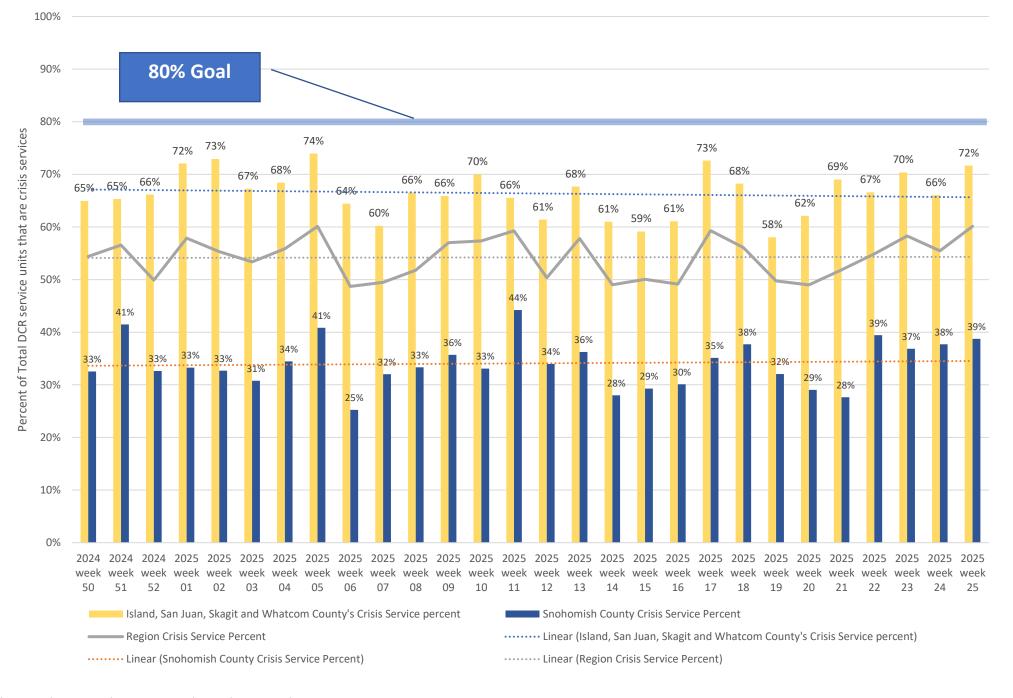

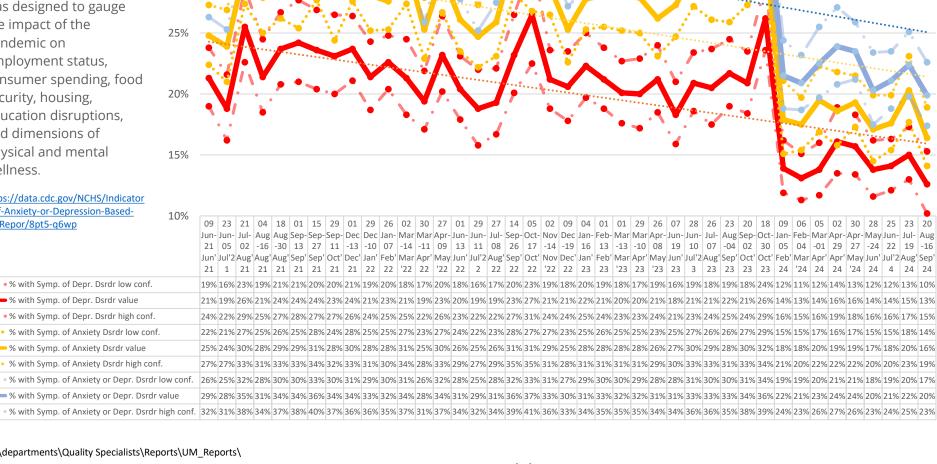
